



## Additional Terms

Additional terms and their conditions of use in Australia:

Term	Conditions of use
Icewine	<p>For wine originating in Australia, the terms "Icewine", "ice wine" or "ice-wine" must only be used in the description and presentation of a wine intended to be sold in Australia when the wine is obtained exclusively from grapes naturally frozen on the vine.</p> <p>For wine originating in a country that is a party to the World Wine Trade Group Agreement on Requirements for Wine Labelling (entered into force on 1 June 2012), the terms "Icewine", "ice wine" or "ice-wine" must only be used in the description and presentation of a wine when the wine is obtained exclusively from grapes naturally frozen on the vine.</p>
Methodo Champenoise	<p>The term "Methodo Champenoise" may only be used in the description and presentation of wines originating in the place indicated by the geographical indication "Champagne".</p>
Moscato	<p>The term "Moscato" must only be used in the description and presentation of a wine when 85% of the wine is obtained from Muscat varieties.</p> <p>Wine Australia considers the following (with any valid synonyms) to be Muscat varieties:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Muscat a Petits Grains ("red" "white" and "brown" variants including "frontignac" synonyms)</li><li>▪ Muscat of Alexandria (Muscat Gordo and synonyms)</li><li>▪ Muscat Hamburg</li><li>▪ Orange Muscat</li><li>▪ Morio Muskat (note spelling)</li><li>▪ Moscato Giallo</li><li>▪ Canada Muscat</li><li>▪ Diamond Muscat</li><li>▪ Summer Muscat</li><li>▪ Gewurtztraminer (aka traminer musque).</li><li>▪ Sun Muscat</li><li>▪ Hawson's Seedless Muscat; and</li><li>▪ Muscat Ottonel.</li></ul>
